Use the following thoughts and questions to have a spiritual conversation as a family. Don't emphasize having the right answer, but focus on spending time discussing the Word as a family.

SCRIPTURE

Genesis 1:26-28; 2:18-23; Psalm 8:1-9

SESSION SUMMARY

In this week's session, we looked at God's creation of humanity in Genesis 1-2. Many things make human beings distinct: verbal and written languages, expansive civilizations, modern technologies, etc. But one thing in particular that makes us unique among every creature is that we are made in the image of God. Here are some of the main things we learned from the story:

- We bear God's image in our roles (Gen. 1:26-28)
- We bear God's image through our relationships (Gen. 2:18-23)
- We bear God's image as a crown of glory and honor (Ps. 8:1-9).

CONVERSATION QUESTIONS

- Why is it important for us to understand that we are different from other creatures?
- · How can we display God's character more through our relationships?
- · How might acknowledging God's image in other people affect how we treat them?

FAMILY CHALLENGE

Play a drawing game as a family, such as Pictionary or Telestrations. The goal of each of these games is to accurately portray an object or animal so that other people can see what the image represents. Discuss how we should live in a way that accurately portrays the character of Jesus to the people around us. Do other people see Him when they look at us? If not, what can we do to display Him more?
